

Who is Danush?



Danush is a young adult who is full of energy and life. When he was a baby, Danush was diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy (CP) - a neurological disorder that affects muscle tone, movement, and motor skills. He is currently in the Vocational Training Unit at Dilmah's National Centre for Children with Cerebral Palsy and other Developmental Disorders (NCCCPDD). Danush takes lessons on basic computer skills and engages in independent living skills. He cannot

speak so he uses a method called eye gaze to communicate with his family and friends.

What does Danush want from you?

CP is only a part of Danush's life - his disability does not define him as a person. Danush doesn't want your pity or stares. He simply wants your love, care and support that will make him feel like any other ordinary boy.






Yellowstone National Park

Yellowstone National ParkUSA





The national park was established on March 1, 1872, by President Ulysses S. Grant. It is well known for its dense concentration of mud pots, steam vents and hot springs. It has more than 500 active geysers and 'Old Faithful' is the most famous of all of them as it is capable of spewing 180 feet into the air.






▲ Grand Prismatic Springs

Quick Facts

- Yellowstone National Park is the world's first national park.
- Around 4 million people visit the park every year.
- This national park experiences approximately 1,000 to 3,000 earthquakes every year.
- 80% of the land is covered by forest, 15% is grassland, and 5% is water.
- This park is home to the largest hot springs which are called the Grand Prismatic Springs.




- One of the earliest explorers to the national park was stranded there for 37 days.
- This National Park is also a designated World Heritage Site and designated Biosphere Reserve.
- With an area of 28,000 square acres.
 It is the largest intact temperate ecosystem in the world.





▲ Steambe

- It is also home to 'Steamboat', the world's tallest active geyser. It can erupt more than 300 feet.
- John Colter was the first white man to see Yellowstone in 1807. He was a member of the Lewis and Clark Expedition.
- There are more free-roaming wildlife in Yellowstone National Park than in the all 48 lower states combined. You will find: Moose, Wolves, Bears, Coyote, Bobcats and many more.
- Eagle Peak is the highest point in the park at 3,462 m.
- Reese Creek is the lowest point of the park at 1,610 m.
- Yellowstone Lake has 141 miles of shoreline and is 20 miles long from north to south.
- Yellowstone is home to many waterfalls, up to 290.
 The tallest waterfall in the park is the Lower Falls at 308 feet.
