Insects and metamorphosis

The young of birds and mammals (like us), have the same features as the adult. However the young insect that hatches out from an egg, looks and acts different from the adult. This young one later transforms into an adult. The process of transformation from this type of an immature form to an adult form in two or more distinct stages is called 'metamorphosis.'

There are two types of metamorphosis - namely, complete metamorphosis and incomplete metamorphosis.



• Complete metamorphosis is where the young larva emerging from the egg, completely changes its body plan, passes through a pupal form before becoming an adult.

Eg: Butterfly, ant, beetle, bee, moth, flea, mosquito.





♦ Incomplete

metamorphosis is where the young that emerges from the egg is the nymph. Only some parts of the nymph's body change during metamorphosis.

Eg: Bug, grasshopper, cockroach, termite, praying mantis, cricket, louse.
