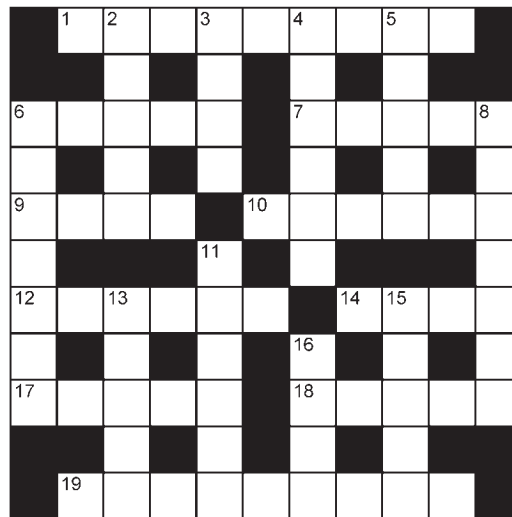

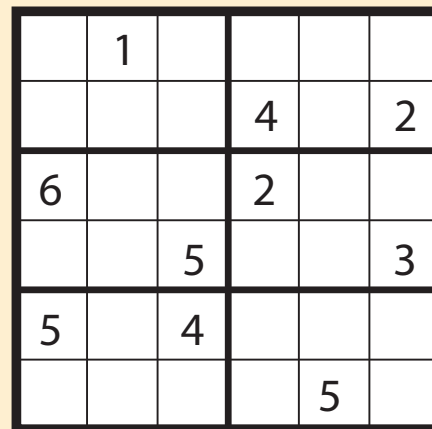

Six horizontal columns with six small squares in each of them.

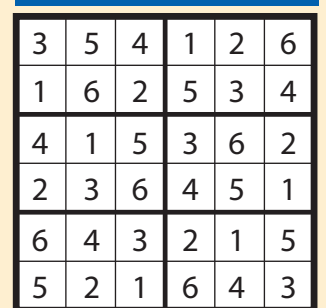
Grids

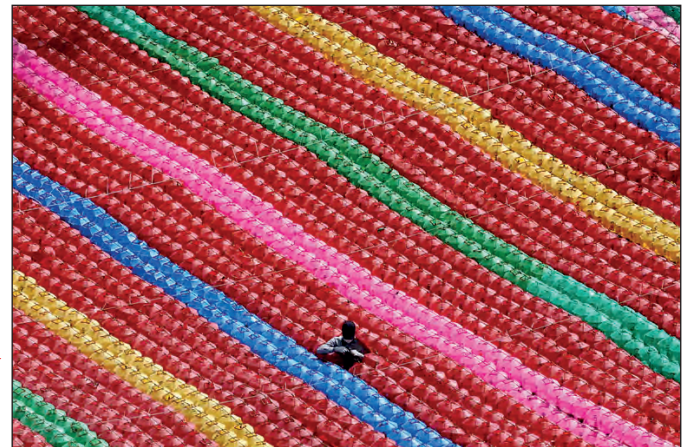

The path of a point on a rolling wheel

Maths in Action 63

By R. N. A. de Silva

Consider a point on the rim of a wheel (or a coin). If you rotate the wheel or the coin one full round, what path will this point describe? The curve generated by a point on the circumference of a circle that rolls along a straight line is called the 'cycloid'. The Italian mathematician Galileo originated the term 'cycloid' and he was the first to study it in depth. Try to draw this curve by rotating a circular object along a straight line.



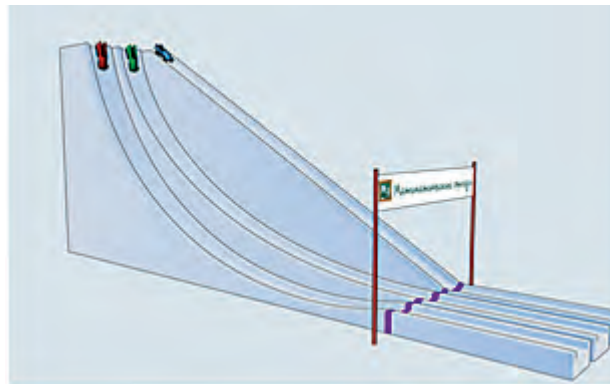
Blaise Pascal, a French mathematician, discovered many theorems about the cycloid. In 1658, Blaise Pascal had given up mathematics for theology but, while suffering from a toothache, began considering several problems concerning the cycloid. His toothache disappeared and he took this as a heavenly sign to proceed with his research. Eight days later he had completed his essay and later published his results.

This curve has some amazing properties, some of which are mentioned below.

It is known as the 'path of equal descent' or 'tautochrone' in mathematics. If balls are placed in a smooth path of an upside-down cycloid shape, they will reach the bottom of the curve at the same time irrespective of their starting positions.



It is also known as the 'path of quickest descent' or 'brachistochrone' in mathematics. The path for a ball to get from one point to another in the quickest time is not a straight line but a cycloid.



For a cycloid generated by a circle of radius r , the arc length is $8r$ and the area under the arch is $3\pi r^2$.



The properties of the cycloids are used in pendulum clocks and in designing roller-coasters to accelerate the car to the highest speed possible in the shortest possible vertical drop.
