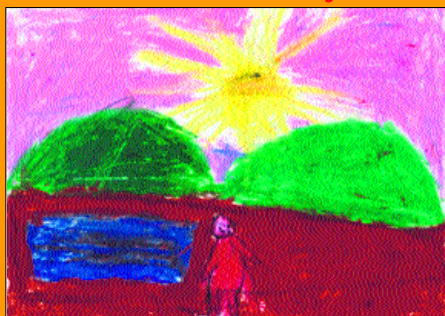
A globe
