Lyceum Wattala International clinches overall C'ship

Lyceum International School, Wattala clinched the overall championship for the fourth consecutive year at the Inter-International Schools Athletic Championship 2012 which was held at the Mahinda Rajapaksa Stadium in Diyagama, Homagama recently. Lyceum Wattala amassed 1008 points and came clearly ahead of Gateway College Colombo by a margin of 110 points to take major honours at the 12th annual athletic meet for international schools.

Gateway who emerged runnersup in the three-day competition accumulated 898 points while Lyceum Nugegoda collected 646 points to win the third plaace.
