Hạ Long Bay

Ha Long Bay or Halong is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and popular travel destination in Quang Ninh province, Vietnam. The name Ha Long means "descending dragon".

The bay features thousands of limestone karsts (land area made of linestone) and islets in various shapes and sizes. Ha Long Bay is a centre of a larger zone that includes Bai Tu Long Bay to the northeast, and Cát Bà Island to the southwest. These larger zones share a similar geological, geographical, geomorphological, climate, and cultural characters.


Ha Long Bay has an area of around 1,553 km² (600 sq mi), including 1,960 – 2,000 islets, most of which are limestone. The core of the bay has an area of 334 km² (129 sq mi) with a high density of 775 islets. The limestone in this bay has gone through 500 million years of formation in different conditions and environments. The evolution of the karst in this bay has taken 20 million years under the impact of the tropical wet climate. The geo-diversity of the environment in the area has created biodiversity, including a tropical evergreen biosystem and a seashore biosystem. Ha Long Bay is home to 14 endemic floral species and 60 endemic faunal species.

Historical research surveys have shown the presence of prehistoric human beings in this area tens of thousands years ago. Ha Long Bay also marked some important events in Vietnamese history, with many artifacts found in Bài Thơ mountain, Đầu Gỗ cave and Bãi Cháy.

In 1962, the Ministry of Culture, Sports and Tourism of North Vietnam listed Ha Long Bay in the National Relics and Landscapes publication. In 1994, the core zone of Ha Long Bay was listed as a World Heritage Site.

Overview

The bay consists of a dense cluster of some 1,600 limestone monolithic islands each topped with thick jungle vegetation, rising spectacularly from the ocean. Several of the islands are hollow, with enormous caves. Hang Dau Go (Wooden Stakes cave) is the largest grotto in the Ha Long area. French tourists visited in the late 19th century, and named the cave Grotte des Merveilles. Its three large chambers contain large numerous stalactites and stalagmites (as well as 19th century French graffiti). There are two bigger islands, Tuần Châu and Cát Bà, that have permanent inhabitants, as well as tourist facilities including hotels and beaches. There are a number of beautiful beaches on the smaller islands.

Many of the islands have acquired their names as a result of their unusual shapes. Almost all these islands are as individual towers in a classic fenglin landscape with heights ranging from 50 - 100 metres.

Another specific feature of Ha Long Bay is the abundance of lakes inside the limestone islands. For example, Dau Be island has six enclosed lakes. All these island lakes occupy drowned dolines within fengcong karst.

'Life Under Dead Wood', taken by Alexis Tinker-Tsavalas. He won the 15 – 17 years category. It shows a springtail - a tiny creature only two millimetres long.



Jack Zhi won the Birds category for this picture of a young falcon chasing after a butterfly.




This picture was taken by Igor Metelskiy after six months of work surveying the locations of lynx. This one - having a stretch on a hill - was found in Russia.
