What happened at the Pokémon World Championships 2025?

August 18, 2025

t's been a busy weekend for Pokémon fans as the World Championships took place over the weekend.

Thousands gathered for the huge event in the city of Anaheim in California on the west coast of America.

The competition saw some of the world's best players come together to battle it out for top prizes and titles.

Competitors took part in four different categories: Trading Card Game (TCG), Video Game Competition (VGC), Pokémon GO! and Pokémon Unite.

Who were the big winners?

Kevin Han from the US took the top spot in the senior division in the Pokémon VGC tournament.

If you think the name sounds familiar - that's because Kevin won the junior division in the same tournament at the World Championships last year.

He's now become the first person in history to win the Pokémon Video Game

Competition in both the Junior and Senior age divisions.

What makes his feat even more impressive is that Kevin won this year's title with a 100% undefeated record.

In the VGC junior division, first place went to another American competitor - Luke Whittier.



Top finisher in the junior division from the Pokémon Trading Card Game tournament went to Yuya Okita from Japan.

"Beelzeboy" Bamb from India was the overall winner in the Pokémon GO tournament and PERÚ UNITE were the winners in the Pokémon UNITE World.

Where will the next Pokémon World Championships in 2026 be held?

The date and location for next year's Pokémon World Championships has been announced.

In 2026, the competition will be held the city of San Francisco in California from August 28 - 30.

12-year-old inventor celebrated by Time magazine

August 14, 2025

A Solar-powered backpack when she was 12 has been recognised by US magazine, 'Time'.

Rebecca, now 13, from Glasgow has been named on the first-ever Time magazine Girls of the Year list alongside nine other girls from around the world.

She came up with the idea of a solar-powered backpack with an electric blanket after becoming worried about homeless people sleeping on the streets during winter.

"During the day, the heat from the sun can energise the solar panels and they go into a battery pack that can store the heat. When it's cold at night people can use the energy stored in the battery pack to sleep on.

"In Glasgow it can be freezing at night and they (homeless people) will have no power, so I thought the solar panel could heat it," she explained. Rebecca thought up of the idea at an engineering club, she then came top in the UK Primary Engineer competition, where more than 70,000 pupils entered ideas

aimed around addressing a social issue.

An engineering company then turned the design into reality, with 30 of the blankets given to a homeless shelter in Glasgow, with plans to make more.

As part of the honour, Rebecca and the other nine winners are appearing on a digital cover of the famous magazine, where they are styled as Lego minifigures - something she said was both "really cool and crazy".

The girls' stories will be featured in TIME for Kids. US news magazine, Time, is best known for its Person of the Year feature which it has run since the 1920s.

the Year are also well-known features.

This is the first Girls of the Year list and honours "10 extraordinary young leaders" between the ages of 12 and 17.

The list also includes15-year-old French singer Zoé Clauzure, who won the 2023 Junior Eurovision Song Contest with an anti-bullying song and 15-yearold skateboarder Coco Yoshizawa from Japan, who won a gold medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics.

Tiny robots help move historic structures in China

team of engineers in China has accomplished a remarkable feat. They have moved and returned a 7,500-metric-ton historic building complex in Shanghai — with the help of tiny robots.

The project began in 2023 when a construction company was tasked with building an underground shopping centre, parking garage and subway lines beneath the Huayanli complex. Built in the 1920s, the three brick-and-wood buildings are classic examples of Shikumen architecture. The blend of traditional Chinese courtyard layouts and Western townhouse facades was once common across Shanghai. However, few of these buildings remain today, making preservation essential.

To protect them while clearing space for the work below, the buildings had to be relocated. However, their fragile frames and the narrow alleyways made traditional moving methods — like cranes and hydraulic jacks — impossible. The engineers needed a more creative solution.

The team began with a detailed 3D scan of the site to produce accurate blueprints. Battery-powered drilling robots then worked around the building's foundation, clearing soil to make space for the lifting robots below. The excavated material was removed using a network of conveyor belts.

Next came 432 miniature "walking" robots. Each was small enough to fit in a hand yet strong enough to lift 10 metric tons. They were carefully placed below the buildings. Working together, they shifted

the massive structures forward in a slow, crawling motion — about 30 feet (9 m) per day. In total, the buildings were relocated about 157 feet (48 m) west and 151 feet (46 m) north, clearing the way for the underground construction.


Once the foundation work for the underground structures and subway lines was complete, it was time to move the buildings back. The return journey began on May 19, 2025. Over the next twenty days, the robots gradually inched the structures into place, finishing the task on June 7, 2025.

With the buildings safely returned, work on the underground project continues. The effort highlights how modern technology can preserve historic architecture — even amid major urban development.


